#### 9. New Business:

1. RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood Annual Overview:
  - a. Kevin Mole provided an excellent overview of the activities of the RCMP National Memorial Cemetery Committee (RCMPNMC) at Beechwood for 2019. A copy of the annual report is attached.
2. RCMP Veterans' Historical Wall:
  - a. Further to his overview of the activities of the RCMP National Memorial Cemetery Committee, Kevin Mole provided an overview of the enhancement of the RCMP National Cemetery project. It is proposed to locate a Historical Wall on the site. By virtue of the tri-partite Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Beechwood Cemetery and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police dated December 19, 2017, ODVA "will continue to seek funding from corporate, private and government entities with the sole purpose of completing a Historical/Legacy Learning Wall". Mole, as Chair of this Committee, and in order to proceed with the Wall Project, explained that ODVA must clarify and establish the RCMPVA's (National) relationship with ODVA as it relates

specifically to the delegation of authorities for the activities of planning, fundraising, communications outreach and construction of this Wall. A MOU is being prepared to be signed by the President of the RCMP Veterans' Association and the President of the RCMP Veterans' Association-Ottawa Division. In order to demonstrate a good faith commitment by ODVA to limit any financial risk for the RCMPVA itself, ODVA wishes to assure RCMP VA through the setting aside of a 75,000\$ contingency to cover any unforeseen shortfall that may occur as a result of the project. Mole also stated that the Wall Project would not proceed with any portion of the project without appropriate funding. **There will be no deficit financing.** At the DEC Meeting of 2020.02.05, Mole made a presentation for approval by DEC for these funds, keeping in mind that such approval had to be presented at the Regular General Meeting of ODVA which was held on 2020.02.11. The Motion was approved by DEC at its meeting on 2020.02.05.

**The RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood  
 Annual Report (calendar year 2019)**

In 2009 through an Act of Parliament, Beechwood Cemetery was officially recognized as the *National Cemetery of Canada*. Beechwood has been a final resting place for many RCMP (NWMP & RNWMP) employees since its opening in 1873. In fact, Beechwood and the RCMP will share an important anniversary in 2023; their 150<sup>th</sup> year. It is of particular historical significance to the Force that some of the 300 North West Mounted Police officers who were part of the “March West” and the original Musical Ride are buried at Beechwood.

In 2001, the Ottawa Division or the RCMP Veterans’ Association began working with the Beechwood Cemetery Foundation to identify an RCMP specific home within the grounds of the National Cemetery of Canada. In 2004, the Ottawa Division – RCMPVA and the Beechwood Foundation formally opened the RCMP Veterans’ Cemetery in section 114. Recognizing the importance of the RCMP presence at the *National Cemetery of Canada* Beechwood, the RCMP Commissioner on January 11, 2006 joined with the Beechwood Foundation and the Ottawa Division – RCMPVA in re-naming and establishing what is now the RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood.

The RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood is one of only 5 RCMP designated cemeteries in Canada. As such, serving and retired RCMP Members are entitled to certain benefits as set out in RCMP Administrative Policy, National Compensation Manual (NCM) – ch. 2.11.

A formal three partner agreement on the governance and stewardship of the RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood was signed on September 7, 2006. As part of that Memorandum of Understanding and others that followed, the Tri-partite partners have agreed to meet at least annually and report on the operations of the RCMP National Memorial Cemetery at Beechwood.

## 2019 Annual Report

According to the [Memorandum of Understanding \(MOU\) dated September 7<sup>th</sup>, 2006](#) between the Beechwood Cemetery Foundation (BCF), the RCMP and the Ottawa Division – RCMPVA (ODVA) *concerning the operation of a Royal Canadian Mounted Police National Memorial Cemetery*, Ottawa:

**6) Amendment, Annual Review, Annual Progress, Duration, Withdrawal and Termination:**

6.a) Annual review: BCF will provide an annual summary of progress of the number of burials and other relevant information. This will include a summary of donations and donation related expenses. The report will be submitted to the Director, Strategic Partnerships and Heritage branch at the RCMP and the President of the RCMP-VA by March 31 annually, to cover the preceding 12 month calendar year.

According to the [Memorandum of Understanding \(MOU\) dated December 19<sup>th</sup>, 2017](#) between the Beechwood Cemetery Foundation (BCF), the RCMP and the Ottawa Division – RCMPVA (ODVA) *with respect to the maintenance and enhancement of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police National Memorial Cemetery, Ottawa:*

**3) Roles:**

3.2 The BCF (Beechwood Cemetery Foundation) will:

- a) Submit an annual report prior to the Annual General Meeting on the availability of burial plots (single and multiple) and columbarium space at the RCMP NMC and make recommendations on how best to manage forecast demand.

<p><b>Availability of Burial Plots (single and multiple)</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 303 burials to date.</li> <li>- 408 lots purchased to date.</li> <li>- 698 lots of varying sizes in the inventory currently.</li> <li>- The west side is in reserve and not formally planned until new road edges have been established to accommodate Historical Wall, etc. The west side will have approx 400 lots of varying sizes when finalized.</li> <li>- Total current available 1800 locations (east, north, south).</li> <li>- As there are roughly a 2 to 1 ratio of graves to lots due to some larger lots and 75/25 double lots to singles we have roughly 3,800+ graves planned.</li> <li>- Allows for 200 additional cremation lots along the west side and to the north with the niches to bring total graves in future to over 4,000.</li> <li>- Approximately 1,600 locations of varying sizes will be available for future as of now depending on layout of niches and trees etc.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Availability of Columbarium space</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Total currently 192</li> <li>- Originally planned for 2 x 48 (96) niche structures.</li> <li>- Nearing capacity so additional two banks of niches (96) added.</li> <li>- Current structures can be expanded to double.</li> <li>- There is a second row of structures planned that leads out from the cenotaph that will accommodate an additional 384 niches.</li> <li>- Current plan for total 768 niches in the two areas.</li> <li>- Contingency plan to add niche structures to north side when needed to allow for total of 1,000 columbarium niche spaces.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Recommendations on Forecast Management</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Some impact due to widening of the roadway with construction of the military building (loss of approximately 100 locations).</li> <li>- North roadway set – Need to expand south roadway – however no further impact to burial lots anticipated.</li> <li>- Road straightening and raising to accommodate future construction of Historical Wall.</li> </ul>
