REST AND REFRESH by the Rev. Canon Dr. Murray Still RCMP Padre

And He said to them, "Come aside by yourselves to a deserted place and rest awhile." For there were many coming and going, and they did not even have time to eat." Mark 6:31 NKJV

As I write we are deep into the summer sun. Schools are out and many families have hit the road or have traveled again following a long difficult two years of Covid restrictions.

We still have the coronavirus with us, but as restrictions loosened, folks returned to their pre-Covid activities as best they could. We have emerged from a brutal winter with -40c temperatures and plenty of snow. That said, the summer heat, while welcome, also brings challenges like the forest fires, while heavy rains bring flooding.

In the midst of the return to routine, we likely find ourselves adapting to new ways of being. Some, for example, continue to work from home. Some are working a few jobs to make ends meet. Others are grieving the losses of those who died from Covid or other means. The inflation rates climbed and the cost of living with it. Adapting to new ways can be hard.

In the church, we continue to offer a hybrid way of being that combines in person and livestream. Pastoral care is moving away from the phone or email to in person visits again. Dwindling finances and maintaining buildings can be problematic.

In short, we can quickly get overwhelmed, much like the earliest followers of Jesus, who recognized the need for rest. In fact, he insisted they go to a deserted place where they would not be disturbed. They, too, were in the business of helping others as Jesus taught. Those who are baptized, or led by the Spirit, often find themselves in the business of helping others. This can be draining, and if not dealt with, can cause mental, emotional, physical and spiritual problems.

Resting is not a negative. Rather, resting allows us to regain energy and refocus. Spending time with Jesus leads to new life as He works within us to motivate. Have you ever been out for a walk and passed by a mini library? They're popping up everywhere. Take a book, leave a book. The next time you walk by, stop and grab one that catches your eye. Read, walk, run, bike or whatever activity you enjoy, and that will bring new life. As I run or walk, I often pray and that prayer may lead to ideas of what other activities might be good, such as visiting those we love to bring some joy and hope.

In these moments following a long Covid battle, we need to find ways to rest in the Spirit. Those who have served a long time and are now retired, still need rest and still have purpose in the Spirit. We find purpose through the gifts we were given in baptism. The Apostle Paul speaks of them in his first letter to the Corinthians.

"The manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all." (1 Corinthians 12:7). The gifts listed include knowledge, wisdom, prophecy, faith, healing, working miracles, discernment, tongues and interpretation of tongues, Each of us has at least one gift, and the utilization of that gift can bring purpose and new life, no matter our age.

Those in active service of policing are already fulfilling a call or vocation from God. There are many vocations. Policing is just one, while teaching is another, along with child care, health care...any work that provides service to others. When we are engaged in the task of helping others, we are prone to overwork and even burnout. Like the early disciples we, too, need rest.

May all who serve in any way, come to understand God has called them to those key roles that others, too, might live. May we find many ways to utilize the summer break to heed the call of Jesus and find rest in the Spirit.

Process for ordering RCMP uniform items for retired members

A process has been established on how retired members can obtain ceremonial orders of dress after discharge from the Force. Often, retired members still wear their red serge for Remembrance Day, Police & Peace Officers' Memorials, Regimental Dinners, or even weddings, special anniversaries, or other relevant events. Retired members may need to update various uniform items such as a new red serge, additional stars, a different sized belt, etc... After discharge, all purchases of eligible uniformed items from the Uniform & Equipment program are at the retired member's personal expense. Eligibility of retired members to purchase red serge uniform items In order to be able to purchase uniform items from the RCMP's Uniform & Equipment program (UEP), the member must have received documented permission on their Form 1733 (Discharge Request) when they discharged to be "Eligible for wearing of uniform and for a Retired Member ID card". If a member has a "Retired Member ID card", they received permission on the 1733. In addition, after discharge, the member must have remained in good standing to be eligible to purchase uniform items.

Process for ordering and purchasing red serge uniform items A retired member who is authorized to wear ceremonial orders of dress, as per their 1733, and has remained in good standing should follow these steps:

- 1. Contact the Warrant Officer in the Division in which you retired for approval to purchase the uniform items that you need. If you don't know who your Warrant Officer is, please reach out to your local RCMP Veterans' Association and they can provide you with the appropriate person or contact the nearest detachment. In your e-mail, please include a scanned copy of your "Retired Member ID card" and a specific list of what items you would like to purchase (see below the list of eligible items).
- 2. The Warrant Officer will conduct appropriate checks to ensure the retired member is entitled to wear the uniform and that they have remained in good standing after their discharge.
- 3. If approved, the Warrant Officer sends an e-mail to the RCMP's Uniform & Equipment Program, carbon copying the retired member, and documenting the approval of the uniform items for the retired member. a. Internal: Uniform & Equipment Program b. External: Uniform_Equipment_Program@rcmp-grc.gc.ca
- 4. The Uniform & Equipment Program will contact the retired member with the overall cost of the items and the retired member will send payment, by cheque only, to UEP. Unfortunately, there are no other methods of payment accepted at this time. Cheques need to be made out to the "Receiver General for Canada" and can be sent to the following address: RCMP Uniform & Equipment Program Attn: Planning & Accounting Section 440 Coventry Road Warehouse Bldg Ottawa, Ontario K1K 2C4 5. The Order will be processed by the Uniform & Equipment Program once payment has been received by UEP. 6. The Order is sent out via Canada Post at no charge to the retired member
