A. <u>Presentation of Prints to Detachment Commander(s)</u> – A/President & Duncan Director

B. Presentation of the New RCMPVA Ensign and its Design Symbolism - A/President

A solid yellow shield in the shape of an RCMP badge represents our "Police" role and our commitment to upholding the law without fear favor or affection.

Centered in the Shield / Badge is a spur design with the shank pointing upwards in red. The spur is one of the most iconic symbols of the Mounted Police dating from 1873 and reflects our respect for our origins. It also symbolizes that Veterans "have earned our spurs"

The rowel of the spur is replaced with a stylized Maple Leaf. It reflects that Veterans served in every region of the country serving and protecting Canadians.

E. Report on the Grave Inspection in Duncan – Tom EARL & Mike BIELING

NWMP, RNWMP & RCMP Grave Markers Cowichan Valley 2023 Inspection Report Tom EARL

At the time of this report (September 2023) there are 41 known graves in 13 cemeteries located in the Cowichan Valley (extending from Ladysmith to Mill Bay/Shawnigan Lake). I am able to report that all grave markers have been inspected and as a result of some work by our guest speaker are in excellent condition.

There is one grave that is unmarked. It's the grave of Sergeant-Major James Thomas FLINTOFF of the NWMP - Reg. #1239. His grave is in Saint Mary's Somenos Anglican Church Cemetery. I have made contact with the graves coordinator at "E" Div. who is

assisting me, through "F" Div. to obtain a free Force grave marker for this deceased member.

Except for one, I believe that all grave markers have been photographed for the national data base. One that has not been photographed is that of Reg Blackmore who's marker is not yet in place.

I have been in touch with two members of our Victoria Vets Association Executive to sadly learn that they are not involved in this project. I have therefore made contact with Mike BYRNE on Saltspring who is interested in doing inspections on the island and that will become part of this report in the future. Once again our guest speaker has identified 12 graves on Saltspring that will be inspected.

Presentation by Mike BIELING

Mike spoke on his work researching, locating, and maintaining military and RCMP (NWMP) gravesites.

The reason for his fascination with this endeavor is multi-faceted. The overall societal elements of graveyards and burial practices are anthropologic evidence of past generations. The research into the records of military and police graves yield a great deal of historical information.

Mike briefed us on the technical aspects of cleaning stubborn organic growth from gravestones using D-2. Mike has supplied this expensive but effective chemical to Tom EARL, and Tom is willing to help other members with their maintenance projects.


